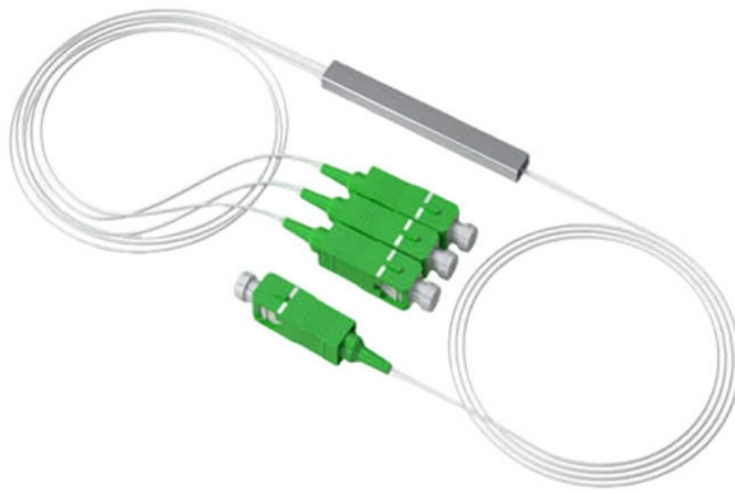


Spacing of vertical cable tray clamps





Overview

Cable Management Tray Size: Choose a tray size that will hold the desired amount and length of cable. Support Spacing: Remember the NEC requires no more than 4 feet of support spacing. Route the Cables: Lay the cables inside the tray, ensuring they are evenly distributed to prevent overloading. A rung spacing of 6 to 9 inches (150 to 230 mm) is preferable when the cable tray is used for instrumentation and control applications that require. Proper installation can significantly reduce electromagnetic interference, prevent fire hazards, and improve overall efficiency.



Spacing of vertical cable tray clamps



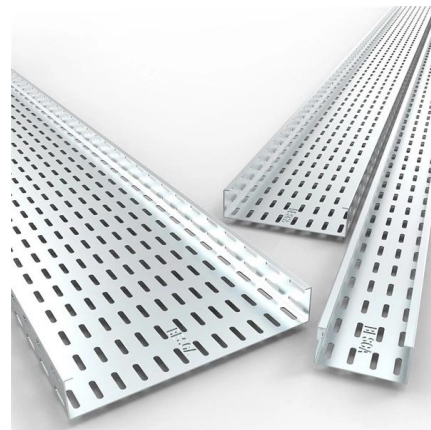

As per the NEC, the maximum allowable rung spacing is 9 inches (230 mm) when cable tray carries single-conductor cables of 1/0 to 4/0 AWG (American Wire Gauge) (Appendix I).



B-Line series Cable Tray Design Considerations

Ladder cable tray is available in widths of 6, 9, 12, 18, 24, 30, 36, 42 and 48 inches with rung spacings of 6, 9, 12 or 18 inches. Note that wider rung spacings and wider cable tray widths decrease the overall

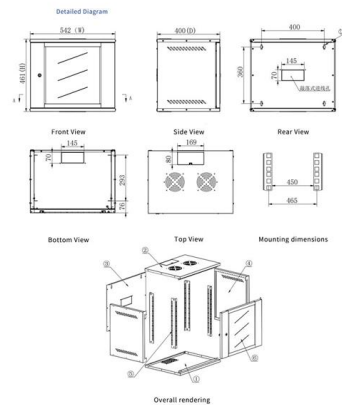
